


### **12th Annual Hunter Arms** Homecoming Weekend August 11 & 12

Bicycle, Hunter Fans, and both the L.C. Smith and Fulton side by side double barrel shotguns. Known for their quality, the Hunter Fans and the famous L.C. Smith guns were sold worldwide.

In addition to the L.C. Smith and Fulton shotgun displays, the exhibit will also include Hunter Arms memorabilia and Al Kraus paintings. The Fulton Mayor, Hunter family members, and the public will be able to vote on the displays. The entire museum, as well as the Hunter Gallery on the second floor, will be open for tours.

A friendly target shooting competition will be held at Pathfinder on Saturday, beginning at 9am. The participants will be using L.C. Smith or Fulton shotguns (some over 100 years old) to break flying clay birds; events include trap, skeet, 5-stand, and sporting clays.

The weekend event concludes Saturday evening with an awards banquet. This year's banquet will take place at RFH's Hide-A-Way on Route 57 in Phoenix, NY.

All activities are open to the public; it's a wonderful opportunity to explore Fulton's rich history.
